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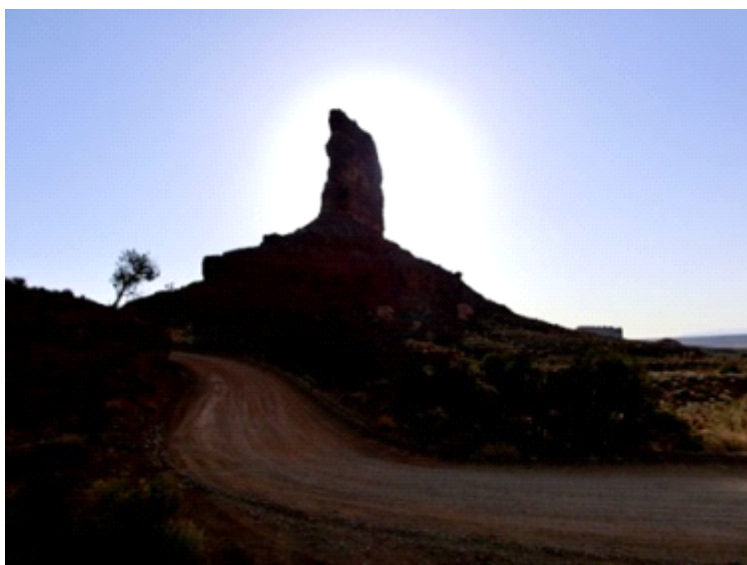
Got an early start and took off for Valley of the Gods from our bivouac in Bluff.
